



Questions & Answers About Bradley Sunrise Rotary

How do I become a member of Bradley Sunrise Rotary (BSR)?

BSR membership is by invitation only. You must be a person of integrity, have an active career vocation, or be retired from a career.

What is the process of becoming a member?

A current member of BSR proposes your name and becomes your "sponsor" for membership. Your sponsor then fills out an application and proposes your name to the BSR Board of Directors who reviews your application for acceptance.

Once your application has been approved, the BSR Board will propose your membership to club members. The name of the proposed member is published two consecutive weeks in the weekly newsletter, during which time any member has seven days to notify the board of a specific objection. If there are none, the club secretary will notify the sponsor to invite the proposed

new members to the next meeting for induction.
This usually takes about two to three weeks from board review to club review and approval. (Plan to attend all meetings during this process.)

Once the club approves

your membership, you will be inducted in a brief ceremony. During the ceremony, you will be asked to share with the club a brief biography (usually no more than two minutes) about yourself and why you chose BSR. You may invite your immediate family or co-workers to attend your induction.

BSR sponsored Italian exchange student Anna Ginestri, who lived a year in our community and attended Cleveland High School.

Is there a cost to joining BSR? What about monthly dues?

You'll find BSR membership dues are lower than most Rotary clubs. There is a one-time application fee of \$50 and quarterly dues of \$55. You will receive an invoice each quarter for your dues. The majority of this amount is sent to Rotary International and to District 6780. A small amount is retained in the local BSR account.

A suggested amount of \$25 for the International Rotary Foundation is added to quarterly statements.



A Paul Harris Fellowship is achieved with every \$1000 donation to the Rotary Foundation. With an average of \$25 per quarter, a Rotarian becomes a Paul Harris Fellow in 10 years.

Where does my money go?

The application fee is used to purchase materials provided in your induction packet. Quarterly dues are used to defray the Rotary membership fee paid to RI semi-annually, which includes the subscription to The Rotarian magazine. Any remaining funds are used for the club's general operating fund.

Once I join BSR, must I attend all the meetings?

Attendance at our weekly 7:00 am Thursday morning meetings is required and rewarding. Meetings are held at the new Hampton Inn located near I-75, Exit 27. Complimentary coffee is available to

Rotarians, plus a variety of breakfast options are also available at very affordable prices.

You must attend at least 50% of your local club meetings. You can "make-up" missed meetings two weeks prior to an absence or within two weeks after an absence.

It's easy to attend a "make-up" meeting in less than 35 minutes using online access to Rotary International. Make-up meetings can also be achieved by attending BSR

social events and service projects, or attending any chartered Rotary Club meeting which function in many cities globally.

What goes on at meetings?

A typical meeting consists of an opening prayer, the Pledge of Allegiance,



club business and a fun "ice breaker." This is followed by a featured speaker which presents information usually associated with a local enterprise or unique civic project; a newsmaker; local charity; a local government official; an elected public official; medical or science updates; and other topics of



interest. Meetings are promptly adjourned at 8:00 am with the reciting of the Four Way Test.

What specific service projects does BSR participate in?

Our main fundraising project is called the Sunrise Sunset Gala. Revenue raised at this event is used to fund local and global agencies approved by the Sunrise Rotary Foundation Board and the club. All members are asked to participate in the Gala and join the fun of making a difference for many.
